Pastor's Meditation November 2023

The Gales of November, Remembered

Does anyone know where the love of God goes, when the waves turn the minutes to hours?"

Gordon Lightfoot

Singer-songwriter Gordon Lightfoot passed away earlier this year, leaving behind an enormous legacy among Canadian artists. His most-successful song, "The Wreck of the Edmund Fitzgerald" was all over the airwaves in 1976. It discussed, with embellished detail, a November 1975 shipwreck of an ironhauling boat on Lake Superior that resulted in the deaths of 29 crewmen. Living in the Great Lakes region as we do, we can easily imagine the perils of navigating a boat during inclement weather. We get to see first-hand the way storms rage along these large lakes, blowing unabated winds that stir up the waterand cause even the soundest vessel to tip and rock.

Lightfoot's lyrics pose the question, oft-asked when tragedy strikes: "Where was God?" People were asking it in October during the violent attacks that wounded Israel, and they will certainly be asking it during retaliatory destruction of the ensuing war. the U.S., we asked it after September 11, 2001. Wise believers find no easy answers. all-knowing, God. who is knew destruction was coming. God, who is allpowerful, could have stopped it. A loving God, described as simply "Love" in 1 John Chapter 4, could not want to see people suffer and die. So, how do we reconcile these nearly-contradictory understandings of God?

In a deep mystery, reconciliation comes from Jesus, who, though himself God, became a person, suffering and dying just as people do during their worst times. For me, this makes Jesus uniquely qualified to be Savior. He knows first-hand what pain and suffering are like. He knows how it often hurts to be alive in this troubled world. He has felt the storm, experienced the attack, and walked through the valley of the shadow of death.

Romanian-born Holocaust-survivor Elie Wiesel wrote *Night*, based on his experiences as a teenager in the Auschwitz and Buchenwald concentration camps. He described a public event at a camp where three people were hanged, including a child. He wrote:

The two men were no longer alive...But the third rope was still moving: the child, too light, was still breathing...And so he remained for more than half an hour, lingering between life and death, writhing before our eyes. And we were forced to look at him in close range. He was still alive when we passed...

Behind him, he heard a man ask:

"For God's sake, where is God?" And from within me, I heard a voice answer, "Where He is? This is where — hanging here from this gallows..." (Wiesel, Elie, Night, NY: Hill & Wang, 2006, 64-65)

Where was God during the hanging? Where was God during the shipwreck? Where was God in the attack? Right in the middle of it, as close as possible to the suffering and dying. Why? Because Jesus understands suffering at its deepest possible level. Through difficult times we hold on to our faith and wait for a

sense of God's presence, knowing that "The Lord is close to the broken-hearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." (Psalm 34:18)
