In recent years, February has been celebrated as "Black History Month." Accordingly, for this month's meditation, I want to highlight an after-Christmas poem written by Howard Thurman. Thurman is not only a well-known scholar who influenced many civil rights leaders, including Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. He founded an interracial church on the West Coast which still operates. He also had ties to Rochester: In 1926, he graduated from Rochester Theological Seminary, Valedictorian of his class. For 55 years

following his seminary training, Thurman became famous for his insight, his mystical spirituality and his attentiveness to the leastand-lost. Enjoy:

Notes from the Trustees

The winter storm on Friday, December 28th left its mark at both of our church properties, 1862 and 1866 Penfield Road.

At 1866, a large limb fell on Meho's truck and the garage roof. The limb smashed the truck bed cover and the truck's rear window. The limb also put a small hole in the garage roof, bent the garage gutter, put holes in two window screens, damaged the west edge of the house roof and totally destroyed a one year old garage door. All of this damage is being submitted to our insurance company.

Additionally, two trees at 1866, one at the southeast corner of the house and another at the southeast corner of the property, needed to be removed. One tree had rot, making it a threat to the house; the other had a split in the trunk and was leaning toward Penfield Road with three large branches hanging over the road. One branch was almost totally disconnected from the tree trunk. If the tree had fallen onto Penfield Road our church would have had a huge liability issue with damage to property, the electric lines, and possible injury to cars or individuals on Penfield Road.

The trees were removed by Birchcrest Tree & Landscape, Inc. on January 16th.


The church building also suffered some damage. A piece of trim on the south gable is missing and one of the shutters on the south face of the steeple blew off. When a

contractor, who can repair the shutter and create the gable piece, is located, the two repairs will be completed.

All in all, the trustees had an active start to 2023.

MISSIONS REPORT

At our January meeting, The Missions Team finalized a presentation for the 2nd Hour of Sunday, January 15th. We highlighted two local, non-profit organizations which received a donation from our budget in January: Keeping Our Promise, Inc. and Refugees-Helping-Refugees.

The mission of Keeping Our Promise is, "To provide comprehensive resettlement assistance to endangered wartime allies who served U.S. interests in conflict and war zones." A video was shown about Ellen Smith, the Executive Director, and her amazing work with Keeping Our Promise. This organization was the 2022 Winner of the Best of Rochester Award in the category of Non-Profit Organization. You can about them find out more at keepingourpromise.org.

Then Carol Morse spoke about Refugees-Helping-Refugees which is an organization she volunteers with. The Missions Team has supported their work for about five years, since their needs were brought to our attention. It is a grassroots non-profit which is run largely by volunteers and is funded by donations and grants. Their mission is, "to foster the growth, self-determination, and self-reliance of refugees in our city and county." You can learn more about how they work to help each other at rhrroc.org.

As we look toward spring, we have begun to plan a 2023 "**Spring Into Action**" event to help stock the Penfield Ecumenical Food Shelf. More details about that will be in the March Carillon.

In Monroe County, New York, community level is Medium.
