Pastor's Meditation

Remember

Since I've been Pastor here, three groups of people from First Baptist Church and have read the Bible with me. We're on our 3rd time through. This time, one historical event that stood out to me is "back when they forgot Passover."

During King Hezekiah's reign of the Southern Kingdom, which is recorded in 2 Chronicles, 2 Kings, Isaiah and to some extent, the Psalms, the Northern Kingdom fell to the Assyrians. Trying to avoid such a disaster

upon his Kingdom, Hezekiah made holiness a priority. He ordered that all the idols and false places of worship be destroyed. He brought back Levite Priests to restore the Holy Temple in Jerusalem. In the process of cleansing the Temple, the priests re-discovered God's instructions for an annual Passover celebration. Passover, first prescribed in the Book of Exodus, was perhaps the holiest season of the year – and both Kingdoms had forgotten all about it – perhaps for hundreds of years!

It's hard for us today to imagine forgetting Passover. Many of us were "schooled" by Cecil B. DeMille's *The Ten Commandments* movie of 1956, which was shown annually on free TV for at least 40 years, making Passover relatively fresh in American minds. As a result of that movie, even non-Jews know something about Passover. Last month, during our Maundy Thursday service, we read the passage in Exodus that referred to Passover (because Jesus' "Last Supper" was a Passover Meal.)

So, back in Hezekiah's time, the people forgot Passover. Why was that a problem? As the King considered the consequences for his nation, he saw lots of problems, simply put: God had stopped blessing them. Hezekiah said, "The wrath of the LORD came upon Judah and Jerusalem and he has made them an object of horror, of astonishment, and of hissing...Our fathers have fallen by the sword

and our sons and our daughters and our wives are in captivity for this.” (2 Chronicles 2: 8-9). All because they forgot to remember the

Passover. Hezekiah reinstated Passover and preserved his Kingdom for another 100 years.

There is power in remembrance. On Memorial Day, we remember those who died trying to preserve our nation. The richest, most powerful nation on earth often pivots wildly between an uneasy calm and an unhinging crisis. In crisis, we depend on soldiers’ willingness to sacrifice (though I pray we never take advantage of that). If we are honest, we know that we are utterly dependent on them. Much more so are we dependent on God. Think of those times that God delivered you from illness, financial distress, loss of a relationship or some other feared calamity. Don’t forget about it. Instead, stay close to the One who brought you through bad times and can do it again. In remembrance, we throw away our illusions of somehow being independent of God’s help. In remembrance, we consider those times when we absolutely *needed God*. Remembrance connects us with our true nature as human beings: imperfect, vulnerable, often-surrounded by peril, dancing on the head of a pin and utterly dependent on the Divine. We correctly say, “But for the Grace of God, go I.” When times are good, it’s easy to forget, but forgetting somehow hurts us. Instead, we must remember, for there is power in remembrance.

Church Financial Procedures

I have been recording and depositing all money that comes to our church for over 15 years. Jeff Bertrand is the second Treasurer I have worked with during that time. We have very distinct duties and while we coordinate account labels, fund numbers and data entry; the only common item is that we are responsible to the Trustees.

Our computer software, Power Church Plus, is designed to provide all the data recording a church requires and allows users to have access by password that is linked to specific limited access within the system. There are four users, Pastor Steve, Sandra, Jeff, and me. All of us have different access rights within the system.

Pastor and Sandra can only access names, addresses, photos, and birthdays. I can access all those as well as enter pledge values, record every penny that comes to the church, print quarterly statements, do weekly deposits, and print weekly reports detailed and general. The detail is seen only by me and is locked in a cabinet only I have a key to. It is kept 10 years and then destroyed. The general report goes to Jeff Bertrand and Pastor Steve. It only shows dollar amounts opposite key account headings such as: Pledged Income, Loose Offerings, Coffee Hour Funds, Memorial Funds, etc. No names ever appear on any report other than my locked detailed weekly report. When I “post” my deposits weekly, the data is transferred to Jeff’s side of

the system. Jeff sees the funds entered by general categories. He pays all the bills incurred by the church and works with the payroll company. Jeff also receives the Pay Pal Funds and sends me a copy of the contributors weekly for my recording. (Those funds go directly into our bank account.)

Church checks are generated on this system and printed by Jeff. Fritz May signs all the checks.

No one in the congregation, but me, can see what any Individual contributes to the church. Unless someone were to ask me to disclose something on their behalf, I would never say a word. I assume if an individual wants someone to know about a financial gift, they would tell them directly.

Lastly, the financial information is kept in the church office on one computer. All checks are in the office as well. I back up the data weekly when I complete my recording.

I hope this will provide an overview of money handling at First Baptist Penfield.

Missions Report

The Missions Team was pleased to have Cathy Kamp from **Penfield Hope**, Inc. come to speak during the 2nd Hour on March 26th. Penfield Hope, located at 1771 Penfield Road, is a social ministry of St Joseph's Church. Their outreach is, "walking with clients on a path to family and housing stability." The Missions team has recently sent \$500 to Penfield Hope. We support them as a community "partner," recognizing that they are equipped to serve local people's complex needs in a broad and hands-on manner. \$500 was also sent to the **Penfield Ecumenical Food Shelf** in support of local families who struggle with food insecurity.

We sent \$500 to **Cameron Community Ministries** following the massive warehouse fire in their neighborhood. Cameron reached out to 5 families who were displaced from their housing because of smoke and water damage. We wanted to help with items like microwavable food, diapers, baby formula, personal hygiene items--all needed by these people while they had to be in temporary housing.

We have been told that \$1,880 is the total amount that was collected at our church for the **One Great Hour of Sharing** offering for earthquake victims in Turkey and Syria. Again, we thank you for those much-needed donations.

During the month of June, the Missions Team will be helping with the American Baptist Church's **America for Christ Offering**. The theme for 2023 is, "Grace Upon Grace, inspired by John 1:16-17 (NRSV): "From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace..."


