Getting "Unlinked"

Years ago, I attended a pastor's lunch meeting, where each pastor brought her or his own lunch. One pastor friend brought Korean beef from a nearby restaurant. From the moment he opened the takeout container, the fragrant scent of that meal began filling the room. As he ate, I was distracted by the aroma and experienced coveting. I struggled to appreciate my own, less-desirable lunch. I patiently waited until he was finished before asking him what he had eaten. "Bulgogi – Beef," he replied, "Amazing food. I would've gladly let you try some," and I said, "That's why I waited – I didn't want to steal off your plate."

Not knowing what to make for dinner that night, I picked up an order of Bulgogi from that same restaurant. To pay for it, the proprietor swiped my debit card into an attachment on her cellular phone, using a digital application. I received an email receipt later that day. I thought, "This is convenient – no cash register, no receipts to carry around."

Weeks later, though, I received another email receipt, this time for \$50.09 worth of food from that same restaurant. I wouldn't have minded buying another order, even a \$50 order, because that place serves truly great food. The problem was: it wasn't my order. I hadn't been back to the restaurant since that first day. I calmed down when I realized the order wasn't billed to my debit card, or to any other card of mine. The proprietor had simply entered the wrong email address and sent the email receipt to the wrong place. The message gave me the option of clicking on a link to certify that it wasn't my receipt, which I did. Then I was asked if I wanted to be "unlinked" from that credit card, and I happily clicked, "YES." Just like that, the screen reported I was "unlinked." The next time that person ordered food, I didn't get his receipt or anyone else's (other than my own), in all the years since.

I wish that sin and bad habits could be so readily "unlinked." But it is human nature that we persistently repeat bad behaviors, until God, in time, brings changes. Maybe we overly-compelled toward Korean are barbeque, which is my sin. Maybe, as explained in the Bible, we succumb to a myriad of sins in "thought, word and deed." As the prayer continues, we sin "By things we have done, and things we have left undone." Whatever the sin, eliminating it can be exasperating. The Apostle Paul is arguably the greatest Christian missionary ever. But when he thought of his own sins, he exclaimed.

For I delight in the law of God in my inmost self, but I see in my members another law at war with the law of my mind, making me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members. Wretched person that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord! (Romans 7:22-25 NRSVUE). Paul's solution was not some email link, but a real human being with whom he related, someone unique, fully God and fully human, Jesus. He proclaimed, "Thanks be to God, who delivers me through Jesus Christ our Lord!" We can all have that relationship. Christ forgives the sins we have committed, and even continues to forgive us as we stumble and fall. And ultimately, in God's good time, God can change our hearts empowering us so that we don't keep stumbling into the same old habits. What do

you struggle with? Whatever it is, through Jesus Christ, we can be "unlinked."

The purpose was to cover the cost of two unexpected expenses, replacing the east roof over Old Fellowship Hall and tree removal at 1866 Penfield Road (the custodian's house). We have paid the bills and have a surplus of about \$2,000.00. The Trustees have decided to add that balance to the Capital Reserve for future capital projects.

Habitat for Humanity Updates

First Baptist Penfield has been a member of the Penfield Area Coalition of Churches Supporting Flower City Habitat since 1997. In January of 2023 the Flower City, Wayne County and Ontario County Habitat for Humanity Affiliates merged into a new organization that is now called *Greater Rochester Habitat For Humanity*.

Additionally, in March of 2023 the Penfield Area Coalition steering committee voted to join a joint coalition of five other area faithbased coalitions to form Greater Rochester Interfaith Builders (GRIB) with the mission of financing and building a Habitat home every year. The first Greater Rochester Interfaith Builders home is slated to break ground July 22, 2023. The house is located at 108 Ackerman Street in the Beechwood neighborhood. Our Penfield coalition will continue to meet and fundraise as a separate group as will each of our coalition partners from Perinton, Brighton, Greece, Harvest Habitat and Home/Henrietta Interfaith Partnership/Pittsford. The GRIB Coalition is made up of representatives from each of these six Faith coalitions. A monthly newsletter and website will be available soon.

The First Baptist Church of Penfield was established in 1804 in what is now an eastern suburb of Rochester, New York.


We are affiliated with American Baptist Churches of the Rochester/Genesee Region, and nationally with the American Baptist Churches, USA.
