### Pastor's Meditation November, 2021

What do you think about when you hear the word, "November?" Cold rain? The start of the hectic Christmas shopping season? Do you think of four-letter words, like "Snow"?

How about "Thanksgiving?" This year marks the 400<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Thanksgiving tradition. In 1620, the Pilgrims landed in North America after a sick and

deadly trip across the ocean, in which half of its passengers died. They were introduced to Squanto, an indigenous man who is described as, "a member of the Pawtuxet tribe who had been kidnapped by an English sea captain and sold into slavery before escaping to London and returning to his homeland on an exploratory expedition." Able to speak English, "Squanto taught the Pilgrims, weakened by malnutrition and illness, how to cultivate corn, extract sap from maple trees, catch fish in the rivers and avoid poisonous plants." Squanto also introduced them to the Wampanoag tribe, with whom the Pilgrims forged a 50-year relationship.

By the next year, 1621, the Pilgrims had achieved a degree of food security, and decided at harvesttime to have a celebration. They sent out hunting parties to kill enough game for the meal. One observer noted deer meat and fowl were served. Other historians believe that lobster, seal, and swan meat were also served. Apparently, turkey was not on the menu. "Historians have suggested that many of the dishes were likely prepared using traditional Native American spices and cooking methods. Because the Pilgrims had no oven and the Mayflower's sugar supply had dwindled by the fall of 1621, the meal did not feature pies cakes or other desserts..."

Historians aren't sure that anyone called it "Thanksgiving." All that is known is that the surviving Pilgrims celebrated for three days

with a party of about 90 people from the Wampanoag tribe.

In our collective imagination we think of the first Thanksgiving menu being much like today's but it was apparently not. However, one of our images seems to hold up under historical scrutiny: harmony, at least for a time. Two cultures of people from different parts of the world somehow managed to sit down and eat together for three days, without any conflict worth writing down. This can be contrasted with current Thanksgiving celebrations, which may offer all the right things on the menu, turkey and pies, but often lack harmony. Conflict sometimes erupts around the table, particularly when excessive alcoholic intake is involved. Disagreements don't necessarily involve great geographic differences between the parties. The arguing people may only be as far from each other as their choice of "news" channels, or in the distance between the boxes they check on Election Day.

In ancient Israel, pilgrims of a different sort would read, "How very good and pleasant it is when kindred live together in unity!" (Psalm 133) as they ascended the Temple steps. They may have lived far away but returned each year to the center of their faith, where God lived, in the Temple. Even without a temple, we can have a similar pilgrimage. We can be

"spreading the truth in love" (*Ephesians 4:15*)  
When appropriate, we can bridle our tongues. We can walk away. We can say a quick prayer and commit to love one another as Christ loved us. We can use Thanksgiving for its intended purpose, to thank God for the blessings we enjoy, and maybe have a slice of pie. However you celebrate, make sure unity's on the menu.

## **Policies and Procedures**

**\*Updated Thursday, August 5, 2021**

1. Church Entry and Exit - People will enter and exit through the ramp door only. All other ways will remain closed.
2. Sanitizing Hand Gel and Face Masks - Both will continue to be available at the entrance (Usher's Station) for anyone who chooses to use them.
3. FULLY VACCINATED - At the present time, fully vaccinated people should enter the sanctuary and join in the service wearing a face mask and practice social distancing as needed to respect the wishes of others around them.
4. UNVACCINATED or NOT FULLY VACCINATED – Unvaccinated people or those who are not fully vaccinated, are expected to continue wearing a face mask, keep it on for the entire service, and continue to practice social distancing of 6 feet or greater while in the church. Attending the church service online is also encouraged.
5. About the Children - We understand that some children will not yet be vaccinated or not yet fully vaccinated, there will be a section of pews designated for children and their families only at the front of the sanctuary. Just beyond the children's section, there will be a section of pews that will be off-limits for any seating. The remainder

of the pews will be available for general seating.

6. Children's Moment - Anyone providing the Children's Moment in person will be required to wear a face mask, whether fully vaccinated or not.
7. Singing - Any member of the congregation who chooses to participate in singing at any time throughout the church service must wear a face mask while singing, whether fully vaccinated or not.
8. There will continue to be no childcare provided at this time.
9. The offering plates will not be passed, however, there will continue to be a donation box in the back of the sanctuary.
10. On Communion Sundays, the Lord's Supper will continue to be given using sealed, disposable communion cups and wafers to ensure everyone's safety.
11. The regular Sunday Worship Services will continue to be available electronically, over-the-phone, and on the on-line ZOOM platform. **Covid Precautions**  
**(Effective 9/12/2021)**

Anyone attending the ‘modified’ Coffee & Fellowship, and/or Adult Discussion in Fellowship Hall following Sunday Worship must be wearing a mask.

The only time anyone’s mask should be lowered or removed, is when they are seated first to drink and/or eat. The tables and chairs will be setup for this purpose and with distancing in mind. When done drinking/and or eating, masks must be put back on.

Prior to Adult Discussion start time, if people choose to stand to mingle with others while enjoying a beverage or a snack, please do so outdoors. Thank you.

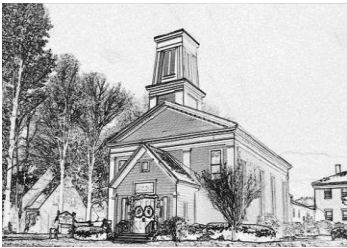
