Pastor's Meditation December, 2021

Light

Years ago, while filming was underway for the blockbuster, *Jurassic Park*, a hurricane hit the Hawaiian Island of Kauai, where much of the movie was shot. The hurricane caused the electricity to go out. As told by actor Jeff Goldblum, the cast and crew gathered in a hotel ballroom during the blackout:

“The lights went out, and I remember (Director) Steven Spielberg took a flashlight and held it above his head and shined it down on himself and said, “Love story,” and then put it under his chin and said, “Horror story.” “Love story. Horror story.” [i]

Spielberg was obviously entertaining people to help take their minds off the hurricane. Probably better than anyone, a film director would understand the effect of lighting on a person's appearance. He knew that *light from above makes people look lovelier. Light from below makes people look scary.* Just a simple re-positioning of the flashlight and he had, “Love story. Horror story.”

At Christmastime, we read scriptures about light, such as, Isaiah 9:2, “*The people walking in darkness have seen a great light.*” Christians often read John 1's treatise on the meaning of Jesus, which says, “*There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world...*”

For the authors of John, and Isaiah, Jesus is the Light. When light shines on people, it can make them look lovely or scary. Jesus' Light has a way of doing both. Because He was sinless, the Light of His example shows us how sinful we are by comparison. In life, people get lost. As scriptures say, “They grope in darkness with no light,” (Job 12:25). Even as Jesus was brought into the world, darkness surrounded; soldiers were trying to kill him. He and his parents had to

seek safety in another country. His ministry was surrounded by often-violent opposition culminating in his unfair death. Nonetheless, his death brought the light of atonement that will overcome the darkness.

Once we recognize our sins, we realize how “ugly” we are. But Jesus’ Light also gives us Hope: Because Jesus died on the cross for our sins, He brings the light of Grace. Grace could be defined as light from Above, that makes us look better than we deserve to look. As U2’s Bono sang, “Grace makes beauty out of ugly things.”^[ii] Even the most-wandering souls are still created in God’s beautiful image.

Jesus’ Light of conviction, grace and transformation can restore us to the beautiful people we were made to be. As we celebrate Christmas, take time to consider the Light of the World, who reveals what a horror story our lives can be without him, but ultimately creates a love story.

“Love story. Horror story.” Christmas is story of Light; a Love story.

Note from the Trustees

- Stewardship Sunday was November 21st. The Trustees appreciate and thank all of you who submitted your pledge forms so quickly. As the Trustees reflect on the 2022 budget, we appreciate your support for the growing cost of operating the church, continuing our many ministries and programs and the hope to hire a student minister.
- In early November we replaced the air compressor motor, which is part of the boiler system in the education building. When the compressor doesn't operate, hot water circulates through the heating system but there is no control over the temperature in each room. When the issue happened, classroom temperatures reached into the 80's before the hot water circulation was stopped and the boiler turned off. A service call by Feldman Heating and Cooling fixed the problem as soon as a motor could be located.
- November is the time for all teams to start looking at their needs for 2022. Jeff Bertrand, the Church Treasurer, will be sending out a reminder but would appreciate your requests in writing before the end of December.
- The 2022 budget draft will be presented for review, the Sunday preceding the Annual Meeting. The budget will be voted on at the Annual Meeting in January.
- We are still interested in appointing someone to complete Bruce Blackman's term on the Board of Trustees. If you might be

Policies and Procedures

***Updated Thursday, August 5, 2021**

1. Church Entry and Exit - People will enter and exit through the ramp door only. All other ways will remain closed.
2. Sanitizing Hand Gel and Face Masks - Both will continue to be available at the entrance (Usher's Station) for anyone who chooses to use them.
3. FULLY VACCINATED - At the present time, fully vaccinated people should enter the sanctuary and join in the service wearing a face mask and practice social distancing as needed to respect the wishes of others around them.
4. UNVACCINATED or NOT FULLY VACCINATED – Unvaccinated people or those who are not fully vaccinated, are expected to continue wearing a face mask, keep it on for the entire service, and continue to practice social distancing of 6 feet or greater while in the church. Attending the church service online is also encouraged.
5. About the Children - We understand that some children will not yet be vaccinated or not yet fully vaccinated, there will be a section of pews designated for children and their families only at the front of the sanctuary. Just beyond the children's section, there will be a section of pews that will be off-limits for any seating. The remainder

of the pews will be available for general seating.

6. Children's Moment - Anyone providing the Children's Moment in person will be required to wear a face mask, whether fully vaccinated or not.
7. Singing - Any member of the congregation who chooses to participate in singing at any time throughout the church service must wear a face mask while singing, whether fully vaccinated or not.
8. There will continue to be no childcare provided at this time.
9. The offering plates will not be passed, however, there will continue to be a donation box in the back of the sanctuary.
10. On Communion Sundays, the Lord's Supper will continue to be given using sealed, disposable communion cups and wafers to ensure everyone's safety.
11. The regular Sunday Worship Services will continue to be available electronically, over-the-phone, and on the on-line ZOOM platform. 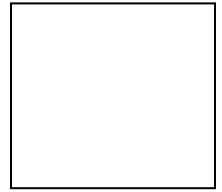
