Pastor’s Meditation December 2023

Christmastime is here! For Christians, the greatest significance is the Incarnation, “God becoming a man,” which makes reconciliation with God possible for sinners like us. But Christmas season also has dizzying accoutrements; gifts, songs, decorations and nostalgia. My favorite of these add-ons is always the songs. My long suffering mother will gladly share that when I was four, I insisted on her playing “Jingle Bells” daily on

our Zenith console stereo. I suppose there would be nothing unusual about that, except that I insisted on hearing it every day - *from December through July*. I’ve never figured out why, except that, as I said, I love Christmas songs.

As years rolled on, Christmas LPs gave way to cassettes, and cassettes gave way to CDs, until the 2010s when many Christmas favorites found permanent residence on my phone. They are likely to remain there for the rest of my life, until some other technology takes over.

Through the years of ministry, I’ve repeatedly encouraged music directors during Advent to use as many Christmas songs as possible. Congregants love to hear and sing them. I’ve confessed to Naomi that I’d request “Jingle Bells” if that was a hymn. Christmas songs are bright and cheerful, the way one should feel about getting right with God. “Joy to the World!” and “Go Tell it on the Mountain, that Jesus Christ is born!”

Included with all these upbeat songs is a somber and little-known melody, “The Coventry Carol.” No Christmas collection should be without it. The Coventry Carol originates in the 16th century and mourns Herod’s insane attempt to kill the Christ-child by ordering the death of every child 2 years old or less. It resembles a sad lullaby. “Herod the king / in his raging / charged he hath this day / his men of might / in their own

sight / the little ones to slay.” The song aches with lost potential, the loving mothers whose innocent children were violently killed, all because of the dictates of a despot. This year, it is more relevant than ever. Our news is flooded with accounts of the horrific slaughter of the innocents, from Hamas attacking Israel, and Israel counterattacking Gaza. It is reported that dictators are on the rise globally. Whatever for? Do humans everywhere have too much freedom? Isn’t there already enough suffering?

Dark times remind us of the enormous gap between “what-is” and “what-should-be.” God became a man to bridge that gap. He entered this oft-painful world and became part of it. He allowed himself to be included among the innocents slaughtered. If you believe, as I do, that Jesus is God, then you know God has experienced suffering. God knows what it’s like to be us. God knows that it hurts, but also knows that evil will not have the final word. Scriptures promise God’s Kingdom, which already exists, but is on its way. We feel the pain of now, longing for God’s tomorrow, always believing that, through Jesus, the final condition of humanity will include songs of joy. Bells on Bobtail ring! Good Christian souls, rejoice!

Each December, the Missions Team presents the **Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering** (RMMO) of the American Baptist Churches USA. The purpose of this offering is to remember, celebrate, and thank retired ministers and missionaries and their widowed spouses for 15 or more years of devoting their lives to serve ABCUSA churches and ministries. The theme for 2023 is, "**Good Will Come.**" It is fitting that **Good** should come back to each of them in the form of a "thank-you" check to express our collective gratitude for their service. According to ABCUSA, the checks in 2022 were modest, averaging \$154, but the gesture is an important part of the gift as well.
