Pastor's Meditation

Happy Easter, Everybody!

This month marks the beginning of the Lenten Season. *Easter? Already? Didn't we just finish Christmas?* Yes, but unlike Christmas, Easter's date can come earlier one year than it did another. Easter is known as a "Moveable Feast," meaning its date changes each year.

During the First Council of Nicea in 325 A.D. Easter's date was then arranged to be the first Sunday after the first Paschal full moon after the Vernal Equinox. *Paschal full moon? Vernal Equinox? What do these mean?*

According to farmersalmanac.com, "Simply speaking, the Paschal Full Moon is the first full Moon after the spring equinox. Also

called the Egg Moon, this Moon sometimes occurs in March and sometimes in April. The word Paschal means "Passover" in Greek (a transliteration of the Hebrew word *pesach*)." According to Britannica.com: "Vernal equinox [is] two moments in the year when the Sun is exactly above the Equator and day and night are of equal length; also, either of the two points in the sky where the ecliptic (the Sun's annual pathway) and the celestial equator intersect. In the Northern Hemisphere the vernal equinox falls about March 20 or 21, as the Sun crosses the celestial equator going north. In the Southern Hemisphere the equinox occurs on September 22 or 23, when the Sun moves south across the celestial equator."

For us here in the Northern hemisphere, Easter is basically the first full moon in Spring. (For people in the Southern Hemisphere, Easter is basically the first full moon in Fall). In 2020, Easter's date will be April 12. The Lenten season begins 6 weeks before Easter. Calculating backward, Ash Wednesday this year is February 26, and the first Sunday of Lent is March 1st.

The word "Lent" originally meant "Spring." As I write this, it's cold outside and snow is on the ground. *Spring? By February 26? Wouldn't that be nice!* But, there's more going on here than the oft-confusing workings of the church year. *The date is unimportant. What's important is what can happen in our hearts during Lent, if we let it.*

Lent was established as a 40-day experience for believers, in honor of Jesus' 40 days in the wilderness. As recorded in the gospel of Luke, Jesus denied himself food and companionship for an extended period of time, so that he could prove his calling as the Son of God. The Enemy rose up to tempt him, but, using Scripture, Jesus resisted. At the end of temptation, Jesus' confirmed what he already knew. After receiving nutrition and care, Jesus walked into the synagogue, opened up the scriptural scroll, and shared that his life had fulfilled a prophecy from the Book of Isaiah, chapter 61. And there was way more to come.

In the same manner, Lent is our opportunity to cast off all the earthly distractions and focus on our true calling. I believe that God has called each and every one of us to do something big or small for the Kingdom of God. But there's a lot of distractions competing for our attention. I am working on one of my distractions right now, a bit early. I encourage you to pray and see what your distractions are and see if God would like you to remove one. Use this time like Jesus did, to confirm what you already know: that Jesus died for all your sins, that God loves you unconditionally, and the Holy Spirit invites you to do something big or small. All this can happen regardless of what the calendar says. Happy Easter, everybody!

- Maintenance, oversight and control of the buildings and grounds
- Hiring, supervision and dismissal of the non-professional staff, including office and maintenance staff
- Creation and presentation of the Financial Budget to the Congregation
- Manage the general financial affairs of the Church
- Supervision of the endowment funds investments
- Oversight of fundraising projects which are not mission oriented
- Maintenance of existing and upgrading of technology
- Designate a Stewardship Committee to coordinate the Stewardship Campaign
- Approve Memorial Fund expenses
