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Pastor's Meditation February 2022

For the first several weeks of 2022, our Wednesday 6pm Prayer Meeting will begin with a devotional reading from Henri Nouwen's *The Way of the Heart*. *The Way of the Heart* is a short book, devoted to the lessons learned from "The Desert Fathers," (and mothers), several third-century Egyptian Christians who fled cities and villages and lived alone, trying to encounter God. The most famous Desert Father is Anthony the Great. As a young man, Anthony gave away a large inheritance and moved to the desert, living as a hermit for many years. During that time, his faith was tested when he experienced temptations and visions. After

decades of subsisting in the desert environment, one might have expected him to return to society sickly and weak. Instead, he returned a healthy and well-adjusted man, having conquered, with God's help, his "demons." People found him a source of helpful advice for over 50 years, until his death at age 105. Nouwen makes the case that Anthony encountered God in solitude, and we can, too. Scriptures support this notion. Jesus said, "But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you." (Matthew 6:6)

After nearly two years of pandemic-fueled isolation, you may ask, "Go to my room and shut the door? It's been like that for 23 months now! How could I possibly need more solitude?" Loneliness is indeed our society's problem and increased mental illness is its symptom. However, *the concept of solitude does not mean loneliness. It means being alone with God, who is there to minister to your needs.* The purpose of solitude is not to run away from others, but to create the quiet conditions necessary for us to hear the whispering voice of God, as Elijah did in 1 Kings chapters 18 and 19.

One may wonder, "Why would Protestants read about the Desert Fathers? Aren't they more a concern of Catholicism or Orthodoxy?" Truth is, the era of the Desert Fathers pre-dates the Eastern Orthodoxy -

Catholic church split of 1054A.D. by about 700 years, and pre-dates the Protestant Reformation by about 1200 years. Therefore, the men and women who fled to the desert rightfully belong to every Christian tradition.

More importantly, what they learned is eternal truth. Spending time alone with God belongs in every Christian's walk of faith. While we have life and breath, it is important to shut off the noise. We pray together every Sunday morning and on Wednesdays at 1pm and 6pm. But other times through each week, it is our job as Christians to be alone and silently pray and wait for the whisper of God. Please join us for Wednesday night prayer group, and let Henri Nouwen describe how, in your alone times, you can hear God's whisper.

Note from the Trustees

Have you missed hearing the hourly chimes coming from our church as you drive down Penfield Road? Unfortunately, our Carillon hasn't been working for several months. Usually we can hear a chime on the quarter hour, on the hours between 9:00 am and 9:00 pm and a hymn at noon.

Our Carillon was purchased in 1962 and provided chiming bells for many years. In 2001 a task force was created to look into repairing or replacing the aging unit. In 2002 a decision was made to upgrade the Mass-Rowe unit that we already owned. The unit was upgraded from the mechanical Chronbell unit to a digital unit. The 8-Track tape player was replaced by a compact disk player and the timing system was up graded to a digital clock. Additional upgrades included a new amplifier, output drivers and a wireless remote control. The remote serves as a "panic switch" to immediately silence the Carillon or to activate the Carillon for special occasions from anywhere on the property.

Once again, we are faced with the Carillon not working. Jeff Phillips and Chris Ahl are evaluating the Carillon mechanics, to determine if it can be repaired or needs to be replaced. Hopefully, once again, we will hear the hourly chimes and the noon hymn. We will keep you posted.

Covid Policies
and Procedures *Revised
Tuesday December 14, 2021

1. Church Entry and Exit - People will continue to enter through the ramp door to ensure mandatory sign in should we need to contact trace. Following the church service, attendees may leave the sanctuary in whatever way is most convenient. Masks must still be worn throughout the indoor areas of all buildings.
2. Face Masks and Sanitizing Hand Gel - Both will continue to be available at the entrance for anyone who needs them.
3. FULLY VACCINATED - At the present time, fully vaccinated people should enter the sanctuary, join in the service wearing a face mask, keep it on for the entire service and practice social distancing as needed to respect the wishes of others around them.
4. UNVACCINATED or NOT FULLY VACCINATED - Unvaccinated people or those who are not fully vaccinated, are expected to continue wearing a face mask, keep it on for the entire service, and continue to practice social distancing of 6 feet or greater while in the church. Attending the church service online is also encouraged.

5. About the Children - We understand that some children will not yet be vaccinated or not yet fully vaccinated, there will be a section of pews designated for children and their families only at the front of the sanctuary. Just beyond the children's section, there will be a section of pews that will be off-limits for any seating. The remainder of the pews will be available for general seating.
6. Children's Moment - Anyone providing the Children's Moment in person will be required to wear a face mask, whether fully vaccinated or not.
7. Singing - Any member of the congregation who chooses to participate in singing at any time throughout the church service must wear a face mask while singing, whether fully vaccinated or not.
8. There will continue to be no childcare provided at this time.
9. The offering plates will not be passed, however, there will continue to be an offering plate in the back of the sanctuary.
10. On Communion Sundays, the Lord's Supper will continue to be given using sealed,

disposable communion cups and wafers to ensure everyone's safety.

11. The regular Sunday Worship Services will continue to be available electronically, over-the-phone, and on the on-line ZOOM platform.
