Pastor's Meditation April 2022

Easter is this April 17th. Though we make a big deal about Christmas, with its catchy songs and splendid decorations, Easter is far more central to our faith. While the importance of God becoming human cannot be understated, in another sense, newborn babies happen daily. How often do self-administered resurrections take place, proving that the baby, who grew to be a man named Jesus, was really God? Christianity is famous

(or infamous) for its moral standards, but every rule kneels worshipfully before Jesus' Easter resurrection. Perhaps another pastor can explain Easter's significance in a better way. Below is taken from an Easter meditation by Frederick Buechner, entitled, "The End is Life." I hope it speaks to you as it did me. Happy Easter, everyone! In Christ, Pastor Steve:

If I thought that when you strip it right down to the bone, this whole religion business is just an affirmation of the human spirit, an affirmation of moral values, an affirmation of Jesus of Nazareth as the Great Exemplar of all time and no more, then like Pilate I would wash my hands of it. The human spirit does not impress me that much, I am afraid. And I have never been able to be get very excited one way or the other about moral values. And when I have the feeling that someone is trying to set me a good example, I start edging toward the door.

So what do I believe actually happened that morning on the third day after he died?

I can tell you this; that what I believe happened and what in faith and with great joy I proclaim is that he somehow got up, with life in him again, and the glory upon him. And I speak very plainly here, very un fancifully. He got up. He said, 'Don't be afraid.' Rich man, poor man, child, sick man, dying; man who cannot believe, scared sick man, lost one. Young man with your life ahead of you: "Don't be afraid."

He said, "Feed my sheep," which is why, like the chief priests and the Pharisees, we try to make that tomb as secure as we can. Because this is what he always says: "Feed my sheep...my lambs." And this is what we would make ourselves secure from, knowing the terrible needs of the lambs and our abundance, knowing our own terrible needs.

He said, "Lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world."

Anxiety and fear are what we know best in this fantastic century of ours. Wars and rumors of wars. From civilization itself to what seemed the most unalterable values of the past, everything is threatened or already in ruins. We have heard so much tragic news that when the news is good we cannot hear it.

But the proclamation of Easter Day is that all is well. And as a Christian, I say this not with the easy optimism of one who has never known a time when all was not well, but as one who has faced the cross in all its obscenity as well as in all its glory, who has known one way or another what it is like to live separated from God. In the end, his will not ours, is done. Love is the victor. Death is not the end. The end is life. His life and our lives through him, in him. Existence has greater depths of beauty, mystery and benediction than the wildest visionary has ever dared to dream. Christ our Lord has risen. (Buechner, Frederick, in various eds., Maryknoll, NY: Orbis Books, Bread and Wine: Readings for Lent and Easter, p.290)

Notes from the Trustees

Last month the Trustees informed you that upgrades to our technology were needed especially for broadcasting purposes.

In late February, Mike Pray and Jeff Phillips met with a representative from Applied Audio and Theater Supply to review what we currently have, suggest improvements and longer term goals.

It was decided that we needed an audio converter that would send our church sound directly into the Zoom output. Also, some adaptors, and a new mic to pick up music

would be needed. The equipment was purchased, at a modest cost, and installed. Sound is now going out to Zoom participants “inline” rather than through an external mic.

Mike and Jeff also talked with Applied about upgrading and replacing the system we have. For \$2,000 - \$3,000, depending on the speakers we choose, we can get a new digital mixer that will feed a signal to the new in house speakers, which will have their own amplification. We would eliminate the current speakers and channel mixer and replace them with a 9/10 channel mixer and two amplified speakers.

Upgrading our technology is going to greatly improve our electronic communication, but at the same time, we strongly encourage anyone who can worship in person to do so.

The Missions Team will be holding a **Spring Into Action** drive-thru collection in the church parking lot, to bolster the Penfield Ecumenical Food Shelf.

Time: 10 A.M. - NOON.

The items needed at this time that **we have been asked to share are: bars of soap, dish soap, laundry detergent, shampoo, conditioner, toothpaste, tooth brushes. Also ground coffee in the "1 pound" size (actually about 11 oz) is needed.** The Penfield Ecumenical Food Shelf remains very grateful for the generous donations from our church family.

On the same morning Penfield Boy Scout Troop 230 will be collecting cans/bottles with a New York State deposit, to benefit humanitarian relief in Ukraine. They have asked us to share the parking lot. Of course, there is space for all. So, if you have cans/bottles that you would like to donate to the Boy Scouts, bring those along too. We hope you can join us in this community mission.

In response to the crisis in Ukraine, the Missions team reorganized our plan for Sundays in March. Since the One Great Hour of Sharing offering of American Baptist Churches USA are funds that are directed to international locations, we decided to move that campaign to March to replace the

America for Christ offering which we will now present in June. Our hearts go out to do what we can to help with humanitarian aid for the people of Ukraine and to the surrounding countries as they open their arms to refugees in dire need. "Let your heart be broken for a world in need..." We are in prayer for this horrific conflict to come to an end.

LENTEN Adult Discussion

Sunday Adult Discussion is based on the DVD series, 'Seven Words,' description as follows:

While many of us naturally wish to avoid the reality of the cross, it's from the cross that Jesus speaks and shows his deepest love for us. It's from the cross that Jesus' full humanity draws us closest to him. It's from the cross, as Jesus breathes his last breath and speaks his last words, that his deep trust in the Father and his divine glory are revealed. Those who listen to Jesus' last words from the cross will discover what he most wants them (the world) to hear and will experience an intimate and divine awe only available to those who are willing to draw near his cross. In *Seven Words*, Susan Robb looks at the seven last words of Christ on the cross through a lens that finds life and hope in his final sayings, while exploring each from a biblical and historical perspective. The book brings a hopeful and contemplative take on the cross during the weeks of Lent. The six-session DVD features Susan Robb guiding participants through the study. The video sessions are approximately 10-12 minutes in length and, when combined with the six book chapters, make an ideal six-week group study. All video sessions are closed captioned.

We are affiliated with American Baptist Churches of the Rochester/Genesee Region, and nationally with the American Baptist Churches, USA.

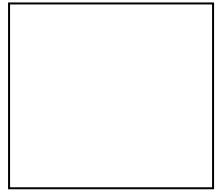
